COURSE CONTENT

- Singing
 - Practice basic correct vocal technique
 - Practice awareness of pitch matching
 - Practice pitch syllables So, Mi, La, Do, Re, High Do; Introduce the pitch syllables Low La and Low So
 - Practice songs of our own and other cultures
- Performing
 - Practice proper performance and audience etiquette
 - Practice basic instrumental technique on classroom percussion instruments
 - Practice basic correct vocal technique
 - Introduce proper recorder technique
- Improvising
 - Practice vocal improvisation using So, Mi, La, Do, Re, High Do, Low La, Low So
 - Practice instrumental improvisation using pentatonic scale: Do, Re, Mi, So, La
 - Practice rhythmic improvisation using quarter notes, quarter and half rests, eighth, half, whole, sixteenth, tied, and dotted half notes
- Composing and Arranging
 - Practice written music notation using quarter notes, quarter and half rests, eighth, half, whole, sixteenth, tied, and dotted half notes
- Reading and Notating
 - Practice reading and notating music using quarter notes, quarter and half rests, eighth, half, whole, sixteenth, tied, and dotted half notes
- Listening to, analyzing and describing
 - Practice listening skills (melody, rhythm, expression, dynamics, tone color)
 - Analyze and describe music in musical terms
 - Analyze simple form and texture in music
- Evaluating Music and Performances
 - Describe music performances using proper descriptors
- Understanding relationships between music, the other arts, and disciplines outside the arts

- Recognize and describe connections between aspects of music and other academic subjects.
- Understanding music in relation to history and culture.
 - Recognize and describe connections between music, history and culture (folk songs & symphonic works)
