6th Grade Update

Happy New Year! 2024 will be an exciting year for Harrison Middle School as we begin the process of reunifying the middle school. The elementary students and staff have now completed their move and are excited to open Lutz Elementary School. With the elementary students out of the building, the district will begin the remodel of Harrison Middle School, creating an inviting and engaging learning environment for our middle school students for year to come.

During the rest of the 23-24 school year the sixth-grade classes will use only a portion of the building as the remainder of the building will begin the remodeling process. The areas under construction will be securely blocked off to all the students and staff. A few teachers have moved their classrooms to prepare for the construction, which included Ms. Salmen's art room, Mr. Lang's & Ms. Hawks's classroom, Nurse's office, and Ms. Dubrosky's classroom. Also, the BCIT and Health classrooms have moved to the 1st floor of the 6th-grade wing, enabling teachers to have their own classrooms. Teachers will share the updated room numbers with their students.

As Dr. Lutz shared last week, Mr. Dini, the transportation director, updated families with the bus numbers and runs for our sixth-grade students. As a reminder, some bus stop times have changed, but those changes

have not been greater than 10 minutes in most cases. Due to the number of buses transporting students to Harrison, some of our students' time on the bus might be slightly longer. Please contact the Bus Garage with any questions.

The changes to transportation, along with being the only grade in the building, have enabled us to update 6th Grade Daily Bell Schedule. The 5th and 6th periods have switched, and lunch will now be served earlier in the students' day. Also, we will continue to use the established car rider drop-off and pick-up procedures outlined in the 6th Grade Information section of the Weekly Update. We will continue to monitor our procedures and make adjustments as needed.

What is Amplify ELA? Amplify ELA helps students in grades 6–8 read and understand complex texts that encourage them to grapple with interesting ideas and find relevance for themselves. Amplify ELA is a blended program that includes both digital and print materials, as well as a print-only version. Students using Amplify ELA read text passages closely, interpret what they find, discuss

their thinking with peers, and develop their ideas in writing. The lesson structure is easy to follow, but flexible enough to allow for a variety of learning experiences and varied enough to keep students engaged.

Throughout the school year, we will provide highlights, updates, and additional information in the weekly updates concerning Amplify. Parents/guardians are encouraged to contact their child's ELA teacher if they have questions or need additional support to help their child.

Arrival: **We open our doors at 8:55am for children.** All car riders need to enter in the main entrance (Entrance # 12) and buses enter through the gym lobby entrance.

Breakfast: Breakfast is free this year and kids are encouraged to take a breakfast from the Grab and Go cart before they head to class. Please make remind your child to make sure they know their lunch numbers.

Water bottles: Non-glass water bottles are permitted for students to stay hydrated throughout the day.

Tardies: Students are considered tardy at 9:15am. Please bring your child to the front door (entrance #12) and our office staff will let them in, provide a pass, and send them to class.

Early Dismissals: When notifying the school of an early dismissal for your child, please complete one of the following: Provide a note and call the 6th Grade office at 412-885-7530 email hecoffice@bwschools.net. Students with an early dismissal must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the 6th Grade Office. After checking out, they will wait for their parent or guardian in the 6th grade office. 6th Grade Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Entrance 12) , check-in with the secretary and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. **Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.**

As a reminder to parents/guardians, if your child is feeling ill, he/she should notify the teacher and request a pass to visit the nurse. Additionally, students may request to use the phone in the 6th Grade Office to call a parent / guardian. While in the building, students are to not use their cell phone during school hours.

PikMyKid: Please continue to communicate with your child's 8th period teacher and the hecoffice@bwschools.net email to update dismissal schedules. It is required in writing any update or changes to a dismissal plan to ensure the safety of all students. Please send an email to hecoffice@bwschools.net and your child's 8th period teacher for any dismissal updates or changes by 2:45 PM. After communicating with the 8th period teacher and hecoffice@bwschools.net , please update the dismissal schedule in PikMyKid. All walkers will be checked out through PikMyKid when exiting the school.

Vacation Requests: When requesting excused vacation days, please fill-out the vacation request form. Once filled-out, please forward it to the 6th Grade Secretaries - hecoffice@bwschools.net, at least two weeks prior to vacation departure. Once approved, you will be notified by the 6th Grade secretaries.

Early Dismissals

Students with an early dismissal, they are reminded that they must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the BMS Office on the third floor. After checking out, they will go to the Security Office and meet parent or guardian. Middle School Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Door 1 - Front of the Building), check-in with the security guard and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.

As a reminder to parents/guardians, if your child is feeling ill, he/she should notify the teacher and request a pass to visit the nurse. Additionally, students may request to use the phone in the 6th Grade Office to call a parent / guardian. While in the building, students are to not use their cell phone during school hours.

Student Tech Tips:

- Remember when your Chromebook is in your backpack, do not throw your bag in your locker or on the floor. To prevent a cracked screen, be sure there is nothing between your screen and keyboard when you close it.
- Eating and drinking while using your Chromebook is not a good idea. Even water bottles in your backpack may leak onto your device. If liquid does get on your Chromebook, do not power it on. Keep the lid closed and bring it to the Tech Office as soon as possible.
- The Tech Office does not lend out Chromebook chargers. If you lose yours, they are \$29.95 to purchase from the Tech Office. Insurance **does not** cover lost chargers (or lost Chromebooks). Please do not purchase an off-brand charger. Those chargers will not be accepted when you turn in your device.
- If a student lost their device. They can stop by the Tech Office for a replacement device. A damage report will be written for the cost of the lost device which can range from \$290.00 - \$353.47.
- If a student needs to borrow a device or charger for the day. There is a chromebook cart located in the 6th grade office. Where a device or charger can be signed out and collected at the end of the day, or when the student is done using it. The number of devices and chargers are limited. If a student is repeatedly borrowing a device they will be asked to see the Tech Office.
- If you are moving from the District, please leave your Chromebook AND charger with a staff member. Do not take it with you. It belongs to BWSD. Remember, you are borrowing the device while you are here.
- Remember to keep your password private. Anything done on your Chromebook is your responsibility.
