


Speaker Brings Lesson of Compassion: On Wednesday, former white supremacist and holocaust denier Tony McAleer visited with middle and high school students to bring his story of falling into hate groups as a teenager and his journey back out. Mr. McAleer credits the birth of his daughters and the forgiveness of a therapist for helping him to see his way to a better life. Speaking to a crowd of over one hundred students, Mr. McAleer and Peter Hutchison, with whom he created the movie "The Cure for Hate, spoke with children about the Holocaust, redemption, and the 'radical compassion' that allows us all to see the best in others and in ourselves.





Traveling the World in Language Class: This month, BMS Level 1 World Language students "traveled" the world with the Passport Project. Students learned about the geography and culture of the countries of their target language. They created maps, colored flags, and researched facts to present to their classmates. Some students also brought in food/drink from their country for their classmates to sample. BMS Nurse Update

Please remember a Pennsylvania school requirement, to enter 7th grade, is the submission of updated Tdap and Meningococcal vaccinations. We still have not received these for several students. If you are among those still needing to complete this requirement for school attendance, please see that you take care of this as soon as possible. Your prompt attention to this is greatly appreciated.

Volunteer nurses from JRMC-AHN will be helping the BWSD nurses with annual vision screenings for our 7th and 8th graders on September 26 and 27th. These will be done during the physical education classes. The high school students will also be screened on these dates.

Current COVID Guidelines for Students were shared with families recently. Please follow this guidance as you note symptoms and positive testing for Covid in your families. Five days of isolation, from the start of symptoms (day zero), followed by 5 days of mask wearing (days 6-10) when returning to school and public life, should be the plan if positive test results are noted. The student's PCP should always be the first point of contact, but also feel free to call or email the school nurses with your questions or concerns.

<u>Arrival</u>: We open our doors at 8:55am for children. All car riders need to enter in the main entrance (Entrance # 12) and buses enter through the gym lobby entrance.



Breakfast: Breakfast is free this year and kids are encouraged to take a breakfast from the Grab and Go cart before they head to class. Please make remind your child to make sure they know their lunch numbers.

Water bottles: Non-glass water bottles are permitted for students to stay hydrated throughout the day.

Tardies: Students are considered tardy at 9:15am. Please bring your child to the front door (entrance #12and our office staff will let them in, provide a pass, and send them to class.



6th Grade Information

Early Dismissals: When notifying the school of an early dismissal for your child, please complete one of the following: Provide a note and call the 6th Grade office at 412-885-7530 email <u>hecoffice@bwschools.net</u>. Students with an early dismissal must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the 6th Grade Office. After checking out, they will wait for their parent or guardian in the 6th grade office. 6th Grade Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Entrance 12), check-in with the secretary and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. <u>Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.</u>

As a reminder to parents/guardians, if your child is feeling ill, he/she should notify the teacher and request a pass to visit the nurse. Additionally, students may request to use the phone in the 6th Grade Office to call a parent / guardian. While in the building, students are to not use their cell phone during school hours.

<u>PikMyKid</u>: Please continue to communicate with your child's 8th period teacher and the <u>hecoffice@bwschools.net</u> email to update dismissal schedules. It is required in writing any update or changes to a dismissal plan to ensure the safety of all students. Please send an email to <u>hecoffice@bwschools.net</u> and your child's 8th period teacher for any dismissal updates or changes by 2:45 PM. After communicating with the 8th period teacher and <u>hecoffice@bwschools.net</u>, please update the dismissal schedule in PikMyKid. All walkers will be checked out through PikMyKid when exiting the school.

Vacation Requests: When requesting excused vacation days, please fill-out the vacation request form. Once filled-out, please forward it to the 6th Grade Secretaries - <u>hecoffice@bwschools.net</u>, at least two weeks prior to vacation departure. Once approved, you will be notified by the 6th Grade secretaries.

Early Dismissals

Students with an early dismissal, they are reminded that they must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the BMS Office on the third floor. After checking out, they will go to the Security Office and meet parent or guardian. Middle School Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Door 1 - Front of the Building), check-in with the security guard and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. <u>Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member</u> <u>or as an emergency contact.</u>

7th & 8th Grade Tech Corner

For 7th & 8th grade students, the Tech Office is located on the 3rd floor of the school building. Mr. Bonidie and Ms. Firek, BHS/BMS computer techs, are there to help students with their technology issues. If your child is having a problem with their Chromebook, place a Student Help Desk ticket by clicking "Help" on the left side of Canvas, or stop by the Tech Office on the 3rd floor as soon as possible. Please remember, do **NOT** attempt to fix your child's Chromebook. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Bonidie (<u>ibonidie@bwschools.net</u>) or Ms. Firek (<u>rfirek@bwschools.net</u>). <u>Please click to access the District Technology webpage</u>.

Student Tech Tips:

- Remember when your Chromebook is in your backpack, do not throw your bag in your locker or on the floor. To prevent a cracked screen, be sure there is nothing between your screen and keyboard when you close it.
- Eating and drinking while using your Chromebook is not a good idea. Even water bottles in your backpack may leak onto your device. If liquid does get on your Chromebook, do not power it on. Keep the lid closed and bring it to the Tech Office as soon as possible.

TECH CORNER

Student Tech Tips (continued):

- The Tech Office does not lend out Chromebook chargers. If you lose yours, they are \$29.95 to purchase from the Tech Office. Insurance **does not** cover lost chargers (or lost Chromebooks). Please do not purchase an off-brand charger. Those chargers will not be accepted when you turn in your device.
- If a student lost their device. They can stop by the Tech Office for a replacement device. A damage report will be written for the cost of the lost device which can range from \$290.00 \$353.47.
- If a student needs to borrow a device or charger for the day. There is a chromebook cart located in the 6th grade office. Where a device or charger can be signed out and collected at the end of the day, or when the student is done using it. The number of devices and chargers are limited. If a student is repeatedly borrowing a device they will be asked to see the Tech Office.
- If you are moving from the District, please leave your Chromebook AND charger with a staff member. Do not take it with you. It belongs to BWSD. Remember, you are borrowing the device while you are here.
- Remember to keep your password private. Anything done on your chromebook is your responsibility.
