# **Upcoming ALiCE Training & Security Drill**

The Baldwin-Whitehall School District's number one priority is the safety of all students and staff. The district adopted the ALiCE Training Institute methodology for strategic planning against violent critical incidents and armed intruders and has assigned a group of administrators and teachers as the ALiCE Core Team. ALiCE stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate. The ALiCE program is a set of proactive strategies that increase chances of survival by providing a system of option-based responses during a crisis. ALiCE training and strategies will empower students and staff with options of survival during a critical incident.

The ALiCE Core team has developed age-appropriate classroom presentations to be taught by Mr. Kealey, the middle school ALiCE Team representative. Mr. Kealey will present to the 7th and 8th Grade students on Monday, November 13th. Mr. Kealey will then present to 6th Grade students on Thursday, November 16<sup>th</sup>. The lessons focus on the core foundations of ALiCE: Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate. The instruction material is intended to provide a life-long skill set to respond to dangerous situations in any real-life scenario, whether inside or outside of a school setting. Students will be taught what to do if an intruder attempts to gain entry into a classroom and how best to distract that person from trying to cause harm. Our School counselors / social worker will be on hand during the presentations to assist students who might have difficulty with the sensitive topic.

7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students, along with the high school students will participate in a security drill on Thursday, November 17<sup>th</sup>. During the security drill, students will receive additional instruction on actions to take during a true emergency situation.

6th Grade students, along with the 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Harrison Education Center students, will participate in a security drill on Monday, November 20<sup>th</sup>. During the security drill, students will receive additional instruction on actions to take during a true emergency situation.

Parents/Guardians who have questions/concerns with their child participating in the ALiCE Training and/ or Drill should contact their child's school counselor to discuss their concerns.

# CURRICULAR UPDATES

Middle School ELA Curricular Updates: Baldwin Middle School is excited to announce that our 6<sup>th</sup>,



7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade ELA teachers will begin to use the Amplify ELA program, which will provide our students with exceptional learning opportunities throughout the school year in their ELA classroom. Starting at the end of the 22-23 school year, the ELA, Special Education & ESL teachers began participating in professional development sessions with representatives from Amplify and

networking with educators from neighboring districts to prepare for this coming school year. The Amplify Program is developed and based on research that is aligned with the science of reading.

### What is Amplify ELA?

Amplify ELA helps students in grades 6–8 read and understand complex texts that encourage them to grapple with interesting ideas and find relevance for themselves. Amplify ELA is a blended program that includes both digital and print materials, as well as a print-only version. Students using Amplify ELA read text passages closely, interpret what they find, discuss their thinking with peers, and develop their ideas in writing. The lesson structure is easy to follow, but flexible enough to allow for a variety of learning experiences and varied enough to keep students engaged.

Throughout the school year, we will provide highlights, updates, and additional information in the weekly updates concerning Amplify. Parents/guardians are encouraged to contact their child's ELA teacher if they have questions or need additional support to help their child.

<u>Arrival:</u> We open our doors at 8:55am for children. All car riders need to enter in the main entrance (Entrance # 12) and buses enter through the gym lobby entrance.

# **Early Dismissals**

Students with an early dismissal, they are reminded that they must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the BMS Office on the third floor. After checking out, they will go to the Security Office and meet parent or guardian. Middle School Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Door 1 - Front of the Building), check-in with the security guard and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.

# Student Tech Tips:

- Remember when your Chromebook is in your backpack, do not throw your bag in your locker or on the floor. To prevent a cracked screen, be sure there is nothing between your screen and keyboard when you close it.
- Eating and drinking while using your Chromebook is not a good idea. Even water bottles in your backpack may leak onto your device. If liquid does get on your Chromebook, do not power it on. Keep the lid closed and bring it to the Tech Office as soon as possible.



## **Student Tech Tips** (continued):

- The Tech Office does not lend out Chromebook chargers. If you lose yours, they are \$29.95 to purchase from the Tech Office. Insurance **does not** cover lost chargers (or lost Chromebooks). Please do not purchase an off-brand charger. Those chargers will not be accepted when you turn in your device.
- If a student lost their device. They can stop by the Tech Office for a replacement device. A damage report will be written for the cost of the lost device which can range from \$290.00 \$353.47.
- If a student needs to borrow a device or charger for the day. There is a chromebook cart located in the 6th grade office. Where a device or charger can be signed out and collected at the end of the day, or when the student is done using it. The number of devices and chargers are limited. If a student is repeatedly borrowing a device they will be asked to see the Tech Office.
- If you are moving from the District, please leave your Chromebook AND charger with a staff member. Do not take it with you. It belongs to BWSD. Remember, you are borrowing the device while you are here.
- Remember to keep your password private. Anything done on your chromebook is your responsibility.
