6th-grade students to enjoyed the Valentine's BINGO on during the afternoon of February 14th. The students listened intently as Mr. Voelker called the big numbers. Thank you to our 6th grade teachers for planning an outstanding afternoon of fun.













Sixth Grade Students Dig Deep to Learn About Land Resources: While learning about the importance of land as a natural resource, Mr. Paulos's and Mr. Bilbie's 6th grade science classes acted as mining engineers and simulated ore mining production using chocolate chip cookies. They focused on the cost-benefit analysis of the chocolate ore production throughout the simulation, which helped them understand the cost of production. As students "mined" with tools such as paperclips and toothpicks, they keep records of their costs—land (cookie),

equipment used, cookie size before and after production, and time spent. The object of the game was to develop the mine, safeguard the environment, and make as much money as possible. Students learned a simplified flow of an operating mine and the difficulty of reclamation, especially in returning the cookie to the exact size before







<u>Carnegie Science Bowl</u>: On Wednesday, February 21, twelve Baldwin Middle School students competed in the Science Bowl at the Carnegie Museum of Natural History. The students competed in teams of four against 29 other teams from schools all around our region, answering questions about American and African wildlife, rocks and minerals, and dinosaurs. In the end, a team of eighth

graders made up of Lily Baumgardner, Keely Duzyk, Natalie Pascarella, and Cheyanne Trout placed third out of thirty-two middle school teams. This is the second time this year that this team has placed in an academic competition, as they placed second at the South Hills Literary Festival in December.

Reminder for Parents of 6th Graders:

Please remember that the PA-mandated examination for 6th grade students is a **physical** that includes a back assessment (**scoliosis screening**). If you have not submitted these for your child, please do so as soon as possible. If you prefer to have the school physician perform the exam, you must complete the written permission form previously given. These examinations will take place during the school day in the health office and are free of charge. Additional copies of the parental permission form will be sent home soon or you can print a copy from the district website or the nurses' canvas page.

<u>Updated Information about the 6th-grade physicals and scoliosis exams:</u> The school physician will conduct these exams in March. Please send in your child's PE from their PCP or complete the form permitting the school MD to perform the exam ASAP. 6th graders will bring a second copy of permission forms home on Monday, 2-12-23. Please watch for these. Dates for the exams at school will be communicated soon.

An Additional Note: The 6th grade physical appointment provides an opportunity for your child to obtain the vaccinations required to enter 7th grade (Tdap and meningococcal). Your child's PCP will attach proof of these immunizations to the physical exam form, thereby ensuring their smooth entry and ongoing attendance on the first day of 7th grade.

Reminder for Parents of 7th Graders:

Please remember that the PA-mandated examinations for 7th grade students are a back assessment (**scoliosis screening**) and a recent **dental exam**. If you have not submitted both of these for your child, please do so as soon as possible. If you prefer to have the school physician and/or dentist perform the exam, you must complete the written permission form previously given. These examinations will take place during the school day in the health offices and are free of charge. Additional copies of the parental permission form will be sent home soon or you can print a copy from the district website, www.bwschool,net or the Health Services canvas page, <a href="https://bwschools.instructure.com/courses/7692.

Additional information for 7th graders: The school physician will conduct scoliosis screenings in March and the school dentist will perform dental exams in March or April. Please send both of these examinations from your child's HCP and dentist in ASAP. Also, watch for a second permission form to come home for school exams.

An Additional Note: It is long past the deadline (8/28/23) to submit written proof of the 7th grade mandated vaccinations (Tdap and meningococcal) from your child's health care provider. If you have not yet submitted this documentation to the school nurse, please do so immediately, as PA law requires these be maintained in each student's health records in order to attend school.

Thank you for your participation and cooperation as we work toward compliance with these PA school requirements.

<u>Arrival:</u> <u>We open our doors at 8:55am for children.</u> All car riders need to enter in the main entrance (Entrance # 12) and buses enter through the gym lobby entrance.

Breakfast: Breakfast is free this year and kids are encouraged to take a breakfast from the Grab and Go cart before they head to class. Please make remind your child to make sure they know their lunch numbers.

Water bottles: Non-glass water bottles are permitted for students to stay hydrated throughout the day.

<u>Tardies:</u> Students are considered tardy at 9:15am. Please bring your child to the front door (entrance #12 and our office staff will let them in, provide a pass, and send them to class.

Early Dismissals: When notifying the school of an early dismissal for your child, please complete one of the following: Provide a note and call the 6th Grade office at 412-885-7530 email hecoffice@bwschools.net. Students with an early dismissal must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the 6th Grade Office. After checking out, they will wait for their parent or guardian in the 6th grade office. 6th Grade Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Entrance 12), check-in with the secretary and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.

As a reminder to parents/guardians, if your child is feeling ill, he/she should notify the teacher and request a pass to visit the nurse. Additionally, students may request to use the phone in the 6th Grade Office to call a parent / guardian. While in the building, students are to not use their cell phone during school hours.

PikMyKid: Please continue to communicate with your child's 8th period teacher and the hecoffice@bwschools.net email to update dismissal schedules. It is required in writing any update or changes to a dismissal plan to ensure the safety of all students. Please send an email to hecoffice@bwschools.net and your child's 8th period teacher for any dismissal updates or changes by 2:45 PM. After communicating with the 8th period teacher and hecoffice@bwschools.net, please update the dismissal schedule in PikMyKid. All walkers will be checked out through PikMyKid when exiting the school.

<u>Vacation Requests:</u> When requesting excused vacation days, please fill-out the vacation request form. Once filled-out, please forward it to the 6th Grade Secretaries - hecoffice@bwschools.net, at least two weeks prior to vacation departure. Once approved, you will be notified by the 6th Grade secretaries.

Students with an early dismissal, they are reminded that they must check-out with a Middle School Secretary in the BMS Office on the third floor. After checking out, they will go to the Security Office and meet parent or guardian. Middle School Parents/Guardians must enter the Main Entrance (Door 1 - Front of the Building), check-in with the security guard and present a valid ID when picking up a student for an early dismissal. Anyone picking up a student for an early dismissal must be listed in Skyward as a Family member or as an emergency contact.

As a reminder to parents/guardians, if your child is feeling ill, he/she should notify the teacher and request a pass to visit the nurse. Additionally, students may request to use the phone in the 6th Grade Office to call a parent / guardian. While in the building, students are to not use their cell phone during school hours.

7th & 8th Grade Tech Corner

For 7th & 8th grade students, the Tech Office is located on the 3rd floor of the school building. Mr. Bonidie and Ms. Firek, BHS/BMS computer techs, are there to help students with their technology issues. If your child is having a problem with their Chromebook, place a Student Help Desk ticket by clicking "Help" on the left side of Canvas, or stop by the Tech Office on the 3rd floor as soon as possible. Please remember, do **NOT** attempt to fix your child's Chromebook. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Bonidie (jbonidie@bwschools.net) or Ms. Firek (rfirek@bwschools.net). Please click to access the District Technology webpage.

Student Tech Tips:

- Remember when your Chromebook is in your backpack, do not throw your bag in your locker or on the floor. To prevent a cracked screen, be sure there is nothing between your screen and keyboard when you close it.
- Eating and drinking while using your Chromebook is not a good idea. Even water bottles in your backpack may leak onto your device. If liquid does get on your Chromebook, do not power it on. Keep the lid closed and bring it to the Tech Office as soon as possible.
- The Tech Office does not lend out Chromebook chargers. If you lose yours, they are \$29.95 to purchase from the Tech Office. Insurance **does not** cover lost chargers (or lost Chromebooks). Please do not purchase an off-brand charger. Those chargers will not be accepted when you turn in your device.
- If a student lost their device. They can stop by the Tech Office for a replacement device. A damage report will be written for the cost of the lost device which can range from \$290.00 \$353.47.
- If a student needs to borrow a device or charger for the day. There is a chromebook cart located in the 6th grade office. Where a device or charger can be signed out and collected at the end of the day, or when the student is done using it. The number of devices and chargers are limited. If a student is repeatedly borrowing a device they will be asked to see the Tech Office.
- If you are moving from the District, please leave your Chromebook AND charger with a staff member. Do not take it with you. It belongs to BWSD. Remember, you are borrowing the device while you are here.
