

2018 SUMMER SCHOOL OPTIONS FOR CREDIT RECOVERY

Dear Student and Parent/Guardian,

On the back of this paper are various options for summer school. Any of these courses may be taken to make up failed courses. **These courses cannot be taken to advance in a subject, only to make up a failed course.**

Please look carefully at all of the options. There are technical computer requirements for the online courses, so please check your access to technology before choosing one of those options.

The procedure for taking a make-up course is as follows:

- Check final grades to make sure you received a final "F" grade – check on Skyward on June 11 or talk to your teacher. You may already know that you will not pass a course and may register early for summer school.
 - Not all courses can or must be made up in summer school. For example, not all elective courses need to be made up. You may be able to retake a course during the regular school year, but most main subject courses must be made up in summer.
 - **Algebra I, Biology, and English 10 may NOT be taken during summer school.** These courses must be repeated at Baldwin High School in order to prepare for the PA Keystone Exam in each subject.
- Complete an application form. A number of the forms are paper registration forms – these may be picked up in the high school counseling office.
- A counselor signature is REQUIRED prior to taking any make-up course, otherwise you will not receive credit for the course.
- Prices listed are per course. Prices are accurate as of April 2018 and are subject to change. The cost of the course must be paid by the student/family.
- Complete your summer course and make sure the grade has been sent to the high school. You can check in mid-August, when summer school grades are received and entered. The best way to do this is to send an email to your counselor.

College in High School - Summer 2018

"Truly AMAZING first college experience"

Purpose of College in High School Program – The principal purpose of the NLA College in High School partnerships is to provide primarily African American Pittsburgh high school students with their first college experience, an aspirational opportunity that we hope will provide the rising 10th, 11th and 12th graders with greater motivation, skills and purpose as they return in the Fall to their high school classrooms.



Program Summary - Neighborhood Learning Alliance will be sponsoring approximately 100 students in class, tutoring and work required time that they will be expected to fulfill. The classes are:

- **English 101** – This CCAC course introduces students to critical thinking, principles of academic writing and rudimentary research skills. Through the writing process, students refine topics, develop and support ideas, investigate, evaluate, and integrate appropriate sources, edit for effective style and usage, and determine appropriate approaches for a variety of contexts, audiences, and purposes.
- **SKW 101, Foundations of Writing**: This Carlow course is designed to teach the fundamentals of college writing and research. These fundamentals include the basic elements of rhetoric (written communication): the organization of ideas, careful use of evidence, reasoned analysis, and coherent use of the fundamental mechanics and grammar of English diction and style.
- **PY 101, Introduction to Psychology**: A survey of the general field of psychology including the fundamental areas of learning, sensation perception, thought, behavior, motivation, personality, social groups, and the biological basis of behavior.
- **Math 080 (Arithmetic Fundamentals), Math 090 (Algebra Fundamentals), Math 108 (Intermediate Algebra)** - students will take placement tests to determine the CCAC math course they will test into. Students will participate in a condensed and rigorous 4 weeks of that course and if passed, immediately enter into the next level math course, where they will spend the last 4 weeks of the program.

Program Dates– The 2018 Summer College in High School program will operate from **Monday, June 11, 2018 through Friday, August 3, 2018.**

Participant Wages – If students want to receive the hourly wage and the weekly bus pass for the six week Learn and Earn program, they need to sign up for the Partner4Work Summer 2018 Learn and Earn program.

Credits – All students who receive a "C" or better will receive three undergraduate credits. Students who receive a "C" or better at Carlow and decide to go to Carlow University for college will also earn a \$2,000 scholarship for each of their four years of undergrad.
