SPECIAL SESSION: IKS HIGHLANDER SIMULATOR ADVENTURES

Dream Flight Adventures™ is an immersive, interactive learning experience that teaches teamwork, critical thinking, and problem solving by blending science, technology, and engineering with social studies, humanities, and art. In other words, it's a real-life Magic School Bus. It's part simulator, part game, and part theater—and it creates an out-of-thisworld experience! The Dream Flight Adventures™ experience centers around an educational adventure that takes place in one of our full immersion simulators.

Children ages 8 to 80 enter the simulator, work together to operate it, and go on incredible adventures. They travel to outer space, under the sea, back in time, through the body—anywhere their imaginations take them! Our players become the captain and crew of these simulators and must work together to complete their missions, and their success or failure can depend on the action of a single person. Our missions are completely flexible and open-ended. Players must think creatively, and each action can change the outcome of the mission. We ignite imaginations, blur the line between entertainment and education, and let dreams take flight.

SESSION 1 CAMPS

Bricks, Camera, Action! Lego Movie Making

Cost: \$50.00 + \$10 materials fee Suggested Level: Grades: 2-8

Teacher: Dr. Harrold

This session will allow students to plan, build, and shoot their own stop-motion Lego movies. Using the iOS Lego MovieMaker app, along with dozens of different Legos, students will learn about the key elements to great storytelling, cinematography, and creativity.

Students will begin by free building to create their Lego world from scratch, or use existing models. Then, they will storyboard their movies complete with key shots and characters. Once their pitch has been "approved," they will start making their own stop motion film. The final day will be a grand showcase of their work!



Introduction to Website Design

Students will be provided with an introduction to website design using a user-friendly drag and drop platform. Students will learn how to design a website by uploading photos, videos and content, along with adding pages and blogs. C.I.A. Cyber Investigative Activities

Cost: \$50.00 + \$5.00 materials fee Suggested Level: Grades: 6-8

Banking, commerce, manufacturing, defense and other industries all critically rely on cyber systems – grave implications can occur if our cyber systems are disrupted. In this introductory camp, you will take on the role of a cyber-analyst and learn to decode and encrypt messages. You will also learn the basics of utilizing global positioning satellites and how they are used to track people. In the second half of camp, you will use GPS technology to explore geocaching. Geocaching is a high tech version of hide and go seek. People place caches (treasures) in secret places with GPS coordinates and your job is to find them! Campers will learn the basics needed for geocaching and will create their own caches to hide around the surrounding area.

Fairy Tale Engineering

This camp will take students on an imaginative and exciting adventure through well-known fairy tales. Each day, the students will enjoy listening to a different fairy tale. After hearing the story, students will be challenged to build and engineer a project tailored to that specific fairy tale. For example, what if Jack in Jack in the Beanstalk had found another way to escape the Giant's realm, such as a parachute? How would the parachute look and be engineered? All of the activities at the camp will enhance key skills used in the engineering design process like critical thinking and problem solving in a fun and creative way.



Running for a Better You!

In this camp, students will participate in a running based camp that will have a daily focus on the theme: A Better You. Learning from an assistant high school cross country coach, students will learn from a teacher and athlete who has ran 6 marathons and competed for the New Balance Boston running club just in the past six years! Topics such as confidence and teamwork will be explored using several activities based around running, including basic stretching and warm up drills that are tied in to the daily theme. Students will learn the basics of running and athletic nutrition while making friends and learning life skills. While the camp will not focus completely on running, there will be a physical element and students will be expected to put forth their best athletic/running effort.



Bake a Better Brownie...And More!

Not only will students have the opportunity to work in the kitchen and learn some basic baking skills, but they will also learn about what goes into their food, kitchen safety, a little bit of math, some science, reading, following directions, patience, problem solving, cooperation/team work, and most of all the joy giving and sharing with others! Terrific Textile Art

Engineering Adventures

Cost: \$50.00 + \$5.00 materials fee Suggested Level: Grades: 3-5 Teacher: Ms. Sopczynski

Throughout the camp, students will be challenged to complete two different engineering projects: To the Rescue and Hop to It! Students will experience firsthand the engineering design process as they initiate, plan, and execute each project. For their first project, To the Rescue, students will personally engineer an "aid drop package." They will work to design and create a package that will withstand being dropped from a specific height without destroying any of the contents while also being easy to find once on the ground. In Hop to It, students will be challenged to design and create a humane trap for a rare species of amphibian that has recently been discovered. Once completed, students will be given the opportunity to share their methodology and designs with their peers as they demonstrate their final projects.



Under the Sea

Cost: \$50.00 + \$5.00 materials fee Suggested Level: Grades: K-2

In this camp, students will learn about life under water as they explore this theme through using their senses. Books will be read to enrich their knowledge of this subject, games will be played, songs will be learned, "aquatic" snacks will be made and served, and of course, the feel of the beach through various sand-enriched activities. At the conclusion of the camp, there will be a beach-themed party!



Weightlifting and Conditioning

Scratch was developed by the Lifelong Kindergarten Group at the MIT Media Lab and is a programming language used to create animations, simulations, interactive stories, games, and much more. As students create and share their Scratch projects, they learn important mathematical and programming concepts along with systematic reasoning and creative thinking.

Who Did It?

During this camp, students will be presented with several "Crime Scene" scenarios, all of which take place in school settings. Students will see the scientific method, biology concepts, and chemistry concepts come to life through practical applications. On the final day of camp, students will use the knowledge that they learned during the course of the week to collect and analyze evidence from a new crime scene!
